On a very cold November afternoon, I sat under a green tent with my mother's coffin in front of me. How many times had I stood in cemeteries, offering comfort and the Word of God to those who had lost a loved one? But this was my first experience of being on the other side of the casket. As I sat there, a shocking thought suddenly popped into my head: This idea was quickly driven away by my faith and confidence in Christ. But it had lasted just long enough for me to feel the despair and hopelessness of such a belief.

To help us appreciate Christ's victory over the grave, let's consider what the outcome of life and death would be without resurrection. First of all, Jesus would still be dead. That means our faith in Him would be worthless, and our message to the world would be a lie. Not only that, but Jesus Himself would be proved a liar since He claimed that He would rise from the dead.

There would be no forgiveness of sins, no possibility of reconciliation with God, and no hope of heaven. Even the believers who have died throughout history would have perished, and we would have no hope of reunion with our loved ones. Without the resurrection, everyone's destiny after death would be hell.

Thank God, none of these scenarios are true. Our Savior lives, our sins are forgiven, death has been defeated, and believers in Christ have assurance of eternity in heaven. After considering how hopeless we would be without a resurrection, let's rejoice all the more in the greatness of our salvation. Dear Fourth Day:

Let me extend my special thanks to all of you in the Fourth Day Community, especially to those who have stepped forward with a number of very generous donations to LVDCNT since January 1, when I became Treasurer.

The suddenly-forced move from Lake Sharon and the quest to quickly find new locations for our Weekends, starting with #83, presented us with a number of financial challenges, in addition to the many logistical ones. This was reported to you in mid-January, and I must say that you have responded most generously. The donors have ranged from "old-timers" to brand new Cursillistas from the last couple of Weekends, and have included both our lay and clergy members. I've personally been amazed at what a broad cross section of people have chosen to donate to this cause!

I understand that we are one of only a very few Via de Cristo chapters in the country who offer "Grace Weekends" to all participants. Obviously, the cost paid to the facility for each participant has to come from somewhere, and this is where the Fourth Day, including the sponsors, become so invaluable. In case you didn't know, the direct cost per Weekend # 83 participant that we paid to Camp Copass was \$155 per person, and we know that future Weekends will have comparable or higher costs.

We will continue to have financial challenges as long as we continue to have Grace Weekends--and I don't know of anyone who would be in favor of seeing them stop!

As a reminder, LVDCNT is a fully registered and fully exempt Sec. 501(c)(3) "Public Charity", so your donations are fully tax-deductible.

Gracemats

Gracemats are another way that you can participate in Via de Cristo weekends. You don't have to be an artist, a great wit, or a great preacher to make a special memory.

Gracemats can help establish community on the weekend. They're great ice breakers and can help to set a joyous tone and bring a unique flavor to the weekend. Gracemats also contribute to the weekend by reinforcing the rollos, telling of God's love and his messages, bringing wondrous laughter and telling of the 4th day community's love.

Gracemats need to be neat, bright, easily visible and tasteful. That doesn't mean they have to be perfect or a masterpiece. Size should be no larger than 9" x 15".

Gracemat pictures may be enlargements of cartoon, "clip art", photo-copies or traced pictures from coloring books, pictures from bulletins, calendars, and magazines. Be open to ideas and use your imagination.

Look for clever sayings, thoughts and wondrous messages on church marquees, in cards songs, sermons, Christian books and of course scripture.

Hug Gracemats are special gracemats given to all on the Week-end. It's great if these are made for the participants and staff from your ultreya. Hug mats brought out on Thursday of a weekend will still be placed on the table. Only one hug mat is given per person at the table. If there is more than one, others are given as bed palanca.

Gracemats are needed from each Ultreya. This helps show the love and extent of the 4th day community. It's time to dust off your markers, colored pencils and crayons and get out your glue and scissors. Put on your imagination caps and have a gracemat party with your ultreya. You don't have to wait.

Gracemats are a wonderful ministry. They bless all that touch them. They bless the one who makes them and the one who receives them. And yes, oh Lord, they bless the one who sorts them.
