Now Here Is A Connection For You!!

Taking A Little Bit Of VDC To The Men At Coffield State Prison

On the weekend of Oct 16th - a group of people from many different Denominations embarked upon Coffield State Prison in Palestine Texas for Kairos Weekend #28. Kairos is a 4th day Cursillio movement designed to meet the special needs of men and women who are incarcerated. Amongst the team of over 50 Kairos team staff members - were five "4th Dayers" from our own VDC movement; Leslie Herd, Ed Kviz, Gail Kviz, Kathy Hunt and Patrick Hunt. The men worked on the inside team and went directly into the prison. The women worked on the outside team and cooked, prepared and made all kinds of Agape. (Agape =Palanca).

There were 42 participants that weekend. Kathy and Leslie were working on the Agape team and had to make a poster with a personal message to all 42 men in less than a couple hours. While brainstorming - Leslie remembered "the word" gracemats used in VDC. They thought up a simplified version of the concept and decided to use it for the poster. They each took the list of the men's names, a Bible and little square pre-cut pieces of paper and went off and prayed for each man. When they were done - each participant had a slip with the word in Capital letters at the top, followed by the scripture verse and the man's name on the bottom of the slip. Then they glued all the words on one poster with the title - God's Word for you.

When the men returned from the prison that day, they were full of stories of how the inmates had been so surprised by the words and scriptures chosen for them that day and were amazed. The staff members were amazed too! With the exception of Ed and Patrick - none of the men had witnessed how the Holy Spirit works through scripture and words chosen especially for participants. One particular inmate had just chosen to give his life to Jesus for the first time that day - and his word was FORGIVEN.

Isn't it amazing how the Holy Spirit works when we can share a little part of our VDC experience with others?
