I was diagnosed with breast cancer last spring. I had a second surgery a few days before the grand ultreya. As much as I wanted to attend, it would also be the last Sunday with my 3rd grade Sunday school class. I'd have to choose, I didn't have the energy for both.

I did encourage my husband, Doug, to attend. He needed the love and the attention of the community as well as me. So off he went, and I was at home feeling a little bit sorry for myself. Imagine my surprise when he returned home and handed me a card. Tears came to my eyes as I opened it and found it filled with signatures, notes of love, encouragement and assurances of prayers. I was graced with palanca. People would always tell me how well I was doing. How could I not be, with all the prayers that were lifted up in my behalf?

Prayer is the power behind palanca. I encourage you to pray. Pray for Weekend #77, staff and participants, and the community. Get up an hour earlier, stay up an hour later, pray face down, or instead of lunch. Find a prayer labyrinth to walk. Pray with someone else each day. Take time for the sacrifice of prayer. Write a note to the people on the weekend to tell them what you're doing. Then follow through. Yes, the Love Team, does a great job, but prayer is the responsibility of the whole community.

News From the Pre-Weekend Team

What, you may ask, is the Pre-Weekend Team and what is its function? Glad you asked! This team is a group people who share an interest in getting the word out about Via de Cristo and in assisting the Fourth Day with other Pre-Weekend functions as needed. Basically, the Pre-Weekend functions are:

<u>Public relations</u>: The Pre-Weekend Team will provide general information about Via de Cristo to any congregation in our area which either requests it or is otherwise receptive to it.

<u>Recruiting</u>: Remember that feeling that came welling up from inside you at the end of your weekend, when you wanted everyone you love to experience what you had experienced? We want to rekindle that enthusiasm and give you the necessary tools and guidance to use that enthusiasm to share the Via de Cristo experience with others!

<u>Sponsor Awareness</u>: Sponsors need to be sure that the participants meet the suggested criteria for attendance at a weekend, and that they themselves (the Sponsors) are committed to support their candidate's Fourth Day experience through small groups and Ultreya activities. A good resource for potential Sponsors to review is page 2 of the application form (available on the web site, NTLS.org, because it outlines the commitment and responsibilities of a sponsor in a concise statement.
