WHO'S WHO: ST. SWITHUN

In case you were wondering...

St. Swithun lived in medieval times - he was born around 800 AD and died on July 2, 862. Not much is known about our beloved Swithun, but we do know some things. He became one of the most well-known and prominent saints of his time. He is best known today as the saint to pray to when in a drought - but more about that in a minute!

St. Swithun was born during the reign of King Egbert of Wessex and was ordained into the priesthood by Helmstad (Bishop of Winchester between 838c - 852c). While there is no factual evidence to support this, he may have been a Benedictine monk and Prior of Winchester. Evidently, he became quite popular because he caught the attention of the king. King Egbert charged St. Swithun with the tutelage his son Ethelwulf. (Oh just-for-fun trivia: the suffix -elwulf means "noble wolf".) The king, having a deep-seated bent for spirituality, considered St. Swithun a close friend.

Now, a little info on the king himself: King Egbert of Wessex (King of Wessex from 802 until 839) gained control over much of the southern portion of England after several battles. He was heralded by the Anglo-Saxon Chronicle as the "Ruler of Britain". (And no, the Anglo-Saxon Chronicle is not a newspaper but a collection of historical medieval writings that chronicled Anglo-Saxon history.) The importance here is that these were very wealthy kingdoms, hence King Egbert of Wessex was quite a prominent figure in the medieval Anglo-Saxon landscape. Ethelwulf succeeded him as king and appointed St. Swithun bishop of Winchester. The diocese of Winchester was one of the wealthiest English sees, and its bishops were often politically prominent Englishmen. So, you see that our Swithun wielded great spiritual and political influence, although his influence weighed in most heavily on the spiritual side of the fence.

So, for the fun stuff. St. Swithun was a great builder of new churches and restorer of old ones. In spite of his prominent position, when he gave banquets he invited the poor, not the rich. He traveled on foot. His most famous miracle was that, while crossing a bridge, he restored a woman's basket of eggs which had been deliberately destroyed by some malicious workmen.

Now, what about the drought deal? Well, while on his death-bed apparently St. Swithun begged to be buried outside his cathedral along the north wall. This was so that his grave "might be subject to the feet of passers-by and to the raindrops pouring from on high". (http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Swithun). In 971, legend has it that a heavy shower occured by which the venerable Swithun expressed his displeasure at his remains being removed. Today, St. Swithun is best known for the tradition that if it rains on St. Swithun's day - July 15th - then it will rain for 40 more days.

Our Via de Cristo table for staff is named St. Swithun's. The name for the table came from the Episcopal Cursillo movement, where St. Swithun's table is still affectionately referred to as "St. Swithun's in the Swamp". In Anglican and Episcopal usage, "St. Swithun's in the Swamp" is a common name for "any church".
